GENERAL MANAGER REPORT

Date: February 24, 2015

It has been a very busy month as we complete the DWTP tasks, prepare for building the Alder Point storage tank, plan for infrastructure upgrades this summer, hire a new operations employee, update equipment inventory and work on policy revisions and a preliminary budget.

We had a mandatory pre-bid walk through for the Alder Point storage tank project on February 10th and had 18 companies represented from as far away as Utah with some from Nevada and southern California. I am optimistic about competitive bids based on the turn out.

We completed staff evaluations last week and have set goals to move forward in an effort to improve our skills and create a positive working environment. My evaluation should take place during March so as to meet the requirements of my contract agreement.

Dave Winters apartment project is proceeding and we are working on how to accommodate the water and wastewater needs while upgrading the infrastructure and service lines for all customers in proximity of the project. We have determined that replacing the sewer laterals and water service lines will be in the best interest of the customers and the District because of persistent problems on that street. I contacted John Neil to include customer wastewater lateral and water service connections in his estimate

We have begun working on the 2015-2016 Budget and will be setting up a time during May when members of the Board can assist in budget planning.

I propose a Board workshop and planning meeting outside of the regular Board meeting. These types of meetings are good because they involve the Board with staff in setting goals, implementing mission and vision statements and overall planning for the needs of the District. This meeting can be on a weekend or any time conducive to your busy schedule.

My recommendation would be to have this meeting at a different yet relaxing location such as a restaurant but the office is absolutely acceptable. Any meeting of this nature would still be posted and open to the public.



### RESOLUTION NO. 15-003

A RESOLUTION OF THE GARBERVILLE SANITARY DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS APPROVING WASTEWATER TREATMENT SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH GYPPO ALE MILL

- A. WHEREAS, Garberville Sanitary District ("GSD") operates a wastewater treatment plant at/near Garberville, California (the "WWTP");
- B. WHEREAS, Gyppo Ale Mill ("GAM") intends to construct and operate a brewery and eatery in at/near Redway, California, and brew beer (the "GAM Brewery"):
- C. WHEREAS, the GAM Brewery is located within the jurisdictional boundaries of the Redway Community Services District ("RCSD"), a California Community Services District;
- D. WHEREAS, RCSD has agreed and will serve and treat all grey and blackwater generated in connection with the restaurant/eatery and kitchen facility at the GAM Brewery, but lacks the capacity and facilities to adequately treat the wastewater generated by GAM in connection with beer fermentation and brewing operations (the "GAM Brewing Wastewater");
- E. WHEREAS, GAM has requested that GSD accept and treat the GAM Brewing Wastewater generated at its Redway facility, subject to GAM's obligation to ship/truck the Wastewater to GSD's Garberville facility and pay GSD treatment service fees, as stated in the proposed Wastewater Treatment Service Agreement between GSD and GAM;
- F. WHEREAS, GSD sought the approval of the Humboldt Local Area Formation Commission ("LAFCo"), and LAFCo's consent and concurrence that providing the service is a permissible service, compliant with limitations on the provision of services contained in the California Government Code;
- G. WHEREAS, at the regularly scheduled meeting conducted by LAFCo on December 17, 2014, LAFCo concurred that the treatment of GAM Brewing Wastewater by GSD is permissible, and not violative of restrictions on the provision of extraterritorial services since all treatment activities will occur within existing GSD service boundaries; and
- H. WHEREAS, GSD is willing to accept and treat the GAM Brewing Wastewater subject to GAM's compliance with the terms and conditions of the proposed Wastewater Treatment Services Agreement

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of the Garberville Sanitary District that the attached Wastewater Treatment Services Agreement is hereby approved and the Chairman of this Board is authorized to execute the same.

#### **GENERAL OVERVIEW AND STATUS**

Over the past few months, staff has coordinated with District Counsel and the Brisbin Family to modify the Connick Creek Waterline agreement as required by LAFCo. The modification consists of changing all the references for APN 222-156-012-000 to APN 223-061-025-000. The purpose of the change is to correct the information to accurately reflect the parcel which contains the two existing water services. The attached agreement was prepared by District Counsel and has been signed by the Brisbin Family Trustee.

Once the District executes the agreement, it will be forwarded to LAFCo. This agreement will fulfil condition 5a in LAFCo Resolution 14-05, which is the final remaining condition that was placed upon the Annexation approval and will allow the Executive Officer to file and record the Notice of Completion for the Annexation. LAFCo Resolution 14-05 and 14-07 is attached should you desire to review the conditions of approval.

### FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The project is within the FY 14/15 budget.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOR BOARD ACTIONS

## AGREEMENT BETWEEN GARBERVILLE SANITARY DISTRICT AND PROPERTY OWNER SERVED BY A WATERLINE CONSTRUCTED BY CONNICK CREEK ASSOCIATION

(Amending Instrument Number 2010-22217-9)

The parties to this agreement are the Garberville Sanitary District ("District") and

- 1. On October 9, 1997, the District entered into an agreement (the Original Agreement) with an unincorporated association known as the Connick Creek Association (the Association) for the purpose of providing water to eight parcels of land within a subdivision located outside the boundaries of the District as it existed at the time. The Original Agreement was recorded in Humboldt County records on February 2, 1998 as document number 1998-2664-11 and was binding on the District, the Association and on the owners of the parcels involved.
- 2. On October 4, 2010, the above-named parties, among other property owners, entered into an agreement (the 2010 Agreement) amending the Original Agreement so that the affected parcels are metered separately and each owner is personally responsible for the water used on his or her parcel and the costs associated therewith. The 2010 Agreement identified the affected parcels by Humboldt County Assessor Parcel Number. In said agreement, the parcel owned by the Brisbin Family Trust was incorrectly identified as Assessor Parcel Number "222-156-012-000". Therefore, the purpose of this amendment is to cure the parcel identification error contained in the 2010 Agreement and to correctly identify the parcel as Assessor Parcel Number "223-061-025-000".
- 3. The October 2010 Agreement was recorded in the Humboldt County records on October 8, 2010 as document number 2010-22217-9.

The parties, therefore, agree as follows:

4. Any and all references to Assessor Parcel Number "222-156-012-000" in the 2010 Agreement is hereby amended and replaced with "223-061-025-000".

5. This amendment exclusively affects that parcel owned by the Brisbin Family Trust. All

## ACTING AS THE CONDUCTING AUTHORITY, ORDERING THE ANNEXATION OF GARBERVILLE WATER COMPANY SERVICED PROPERTIES TO THE GARBERVILLE SANITARY DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the Humboldt Local Agency Formation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission," adopted Resolution No. 14-05, subject to terms and conditions, on July 16, 2014, after holding a public hearing, making determinations, and approving the Annexation of Garberville Water Company Serviced Properties to the Garberville Sanitary District in accordance with proceedings taken pursuant to Part 3, Division 3, Title 5 of the California Government Code (commencing with Section 56650, Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000); and

WHEREAS, the Commission serves as the conducting authority for proceedings taken pursuant to Part 4, Division 3, Title 5 of the California Government Code (commencing with Section 57000, Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000) to determine whether the proposal outcome is confirmed, terminated, or subject to an election based on written protests received from landowners and registered voters residing within the subject territory in accordance with California Government Code Section 57075; and

WHEREAS, the Commission delegated authority to the LAFCo Executive Officer to order, hold, and report on conducting authority proceedings pursuant to California Government Code Section 57000(c); and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer held a public hearing at the City Council Chambers at the GSD Office, 919 Redwood Drive, Garberville, on September 8, 2014, after providing sufficient notice of the hearing in the form and manner prescribed by law; and

WHEREAS, at said hearing, the Executive Officer summarized the determinations, terms and conditions included in Resolution No. 14-05, and heard and received all oral and written protests, objections, and evidence presented; and

WHEREAS, upon conclusion of the protest hearing, the Executive Officer determined the value of written protests filed and not withdrawn, which consisted of one (1) registered voter protest and one (1) landowner protest.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commission as follows:

1. The Commission, acting as the conducting authority, hereby orders the Annexation of Garberville Water Company Serviced Properties to the Garberville Sanitary District without election, pursuant to California Government Code Section 57075(a) (3).

2. The Commission hereby authorizes and directs the Executive Officer to file a Certificate of Completion upon the satisfaction of the terms and conditions in LAFCo Resolution No. 14-05.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 14-05**

## APPROVING THE ANNEXATION OF GARBERVILLE WATER COMPANY SERVICED PROPERTIES TO THE GARBERVILLE SANITARY DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Humboldt Local Agency Formation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission," is responsible for regulating boundary changes affecting cities and special districts pursuant to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000; and

WHEREAS, the Garberville Sanitary District filed a proposal with the Commission by resolution of application; and

WHERAS, the affected territory is inhabited as defined in Government Code Section 56046; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer's report and recommendations on the proposal were presented to the Commission in the manner provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the Commission heard and fully considered all the evidence presented at a public hearing held on the proposal on July 16, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Commission considered all the factors required by law under Government Code Section 56668 and adopted local policies and procedures; and

WHEREAS, the Commission found the proposal consistent with the adopted Garberville Sanitary District Sphere of Influence, adopted by the Commission in March 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Commission provided sufficient notice, including notice of the Commission's intention to waive protest proceedings in accordance with California Government Code Section 56663.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Humboldt Local Agency Formation Commission as follows:

- 1. The Commission's determinations on the proposal incorporate the information and analysis provided in the Executive Officer's written report.
- 2. The Commission, as Responsible Agency, certifies it has independently reviewed and considered the Mitigated Negative Declaration prepared by the Lead Agency (SCH# 2012032025) the Garberville Sanitary District concerning potential impacts associated with the proposal in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The Commission finds the Mitigated Negative Declaration (finding of no significant adverse environmental effect) is

- adequate and directs the Executive Officer to file a Notice of Determination with the Humboldt County Clerk.
- 3. The Commission approves the proposal, with amendment, as provided in Exhibit "A". The proposal, as amended, includes the annexation of approximately 383 acres of land (consisting of 75 Assessor's parcels) to the Garberville Sanitary District. In lieu of being annexed, the properties served by the Connick Creek Association's private waterline, including 10 metered connections on 9 Assessor's parcels (APN 222-156-014, -015, -016, -017, -018, -019, -020, -021 and 223-061-025), are approved as an out-of-agency service pursuant to Government Code Section 56133.
- 4. The effective date shall be the date of recordation of the Certificate of Completion. The Certificate of Completion must be filed within one calendar year from the date of approval unless a time extension is approved by the Commission.
- 5. Recordation is contingent upon the satisfaction of following terms and conditions as determined by the Executive Officer:
  - a) The existing service agreement(s) between the Garberville Sanitary District and the property owners served by the Connick Creek Association's private waterline shall be amended or modified to include the connections on APN 223-061-025.
  - b) Completion of the 30-day reconsideration period provided under G.C. Section 56895.
  - c) Completion of conducting authority proceedings by Executive Officer (unless waived pursuant to Government Code Section 56663).
  - d) Submittal of a final map and geographic description of the affected territory as amended by the Commission conforming to State Board of Equalization requirements.
  - e) Payment of any outstanding fees as identified in the Commission's adopted fee schedule.
- 6. Upon effective date of the proposal, the affected territory will be subject to all previously authorized charges, fees, assessments, and taxes that were lawfully enacted by the Garberville Sanitary District. The affected territory will also be subject to all of the rates, rules, regulations, and ordinances of the Garberville Sanitary District.
