



#### WHEREAS:

- The Garberville Sanitary District submitted an application to the California Department of Public Health, dated August 1, 2012, for an amendment to their Domestic Water Supply Permit.
- The purpose of the amendment, as stated in the application, is to permit the consolidation of the Kimtu Meadows Mutual Water Company, a public water system, (System No. 1200517) into the Garberville Sanitary District public water system. This consolidation includes:
  - a. Incorporation of Kimtu Meadows Mutual Water Company's newly constructed infrastructure into the Garberville Sanitary District public water system, which includes 2.5 miles of 8-inch transmission pipeline, transmission pipeline appurtenances, distribution system piping within the Kimtu Meadows subdivision, and service connections and meters to 20 connections in the Kimtu Meadows subdivision.
  - b. Drinking water being supplied by Garberville Sanitary District to the 20 connections within the Kimtu Meadows subdivision.
- Kimtu Meadows Mutual Water Company received funding through the California Department
  of Public Health's Proposition 50 program to construct an 8-inch water transmission main and
  upgrade distribution mains within the Kimtu Meadows subdivision for the purpose of
  consolidation with Garberville Sanitary District.
- 4. The transmission main and distribution mains serving the Kimtu Meadows subdivision were designed to ultimately provide a minimum fire-flow of 750 gallons per minute, after proposed improvements to the Garberville Sanitary District's water system are completed.

- Plans and specifications for the transmission main and distribution mains serving the Kimtu Meadows subdivision were reviewed and approved by the California Department of Public Health, and construction inspections verified conformance with the plans and specifications.
- Kimtu Meadows Mutual Water Company has completed construction of their transmission main and distribution mains and has transferred ownership of the facilities to Garberville Sanitary District. Construction was completed in July 2012.

#### **THEREFORE:**

- 1. The California Department of Public Health hereby approves the application submitted by the Garberville Sanitary District for a permit amendment.
- 2. The Domestic Water Supply Permit (No. 01-01-11(P)004) issued to the Garberville Sanitary District on October 27, 2011, with the effective date of December 27, 2004, is hereby amended as follows:

The Kimtu Meadows Mutual Water Company's infrastructure and customers are incorporated into the Garberville Sanitary District's water system.

3. This permit amendment is subject to the following condition:

Garberville Sanitary District shall not allow new service connections to the 8-inch transmission main, constructed as part of Kimtu Meadows Mutual Water Company's Proposition 50 project, that will reduce the design fire-flow at the Kimtu Meadows subdivision hydrants to below 750 gallons per minute at adequate pressure.

This amendment shall be appended to and shall be considered to be an integral part of the Domestic Water Supply Permit (No. 01-01-11(P)004) issued to the Garberville Sanitary District on October 27, 2011.

IN THE MATTER OF REPORTS.

The reports of the County Treasurer, County Surveyor, County Agricultural Commissioner, secretary of the Department of Public Welfare, and the secretary of the Humboldt County Board of Trade were received, read and approved, and ordered placed on file.

# IN THE MATTER OF AN ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON TAXATION.

Mayor Frank R. Sweasey, T. A. Greig, Chas. M. Kressman, L. B. Campton, J. H. Crothers and C. L. Day, appeared and addressed the Board relative to the 1932-33 tax budget and asked if the Supervisors would not be willing to accept assistance from a committee representing all lines of business and industry throughout the county-acting in an advisory capacity to the Board, and suggested that the members of this Board appoint such a committee if the proposition be agreeable to the Board.

And it being the sense of the Board that such a committee would be of much assistance.to it, therefore, on motion of Supervisor Yocom, seconded by Supervisor Cole, it is ordered that Mayor Frank R. Sweasey of Eureka be, and he is hereby authorized and requested to appoint a committee of twenty-five persons, five from each Supervisorial District, to act as an advisory committee to this Board on taxation matters and the 1932-33 budget.

### IN THE MATTER OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL.

On motion of Supervisor Yocom, seconded by Supervisor Flint, it is ordered that the Chairman and the Clerk of this Board be, and they are hereby authorized to sign an agreement between bridge across Supply Creek in Hoopa Valley, on motion of Supervisor Yocom, seconded by Supervisor Cole, it is ordered that the same be, and they arehereby accepted and furth ordered that the Clerk advertise for bids for the construction of said bridge, the said bids to be received up to Tuesday, May 10th 1932, at two o'clock p. m.
